

# 6<sup>th</sup> Know Goa Programme

Last year two members of our youth group, Shauna Dias and Rene Monteiro, were lucky enough to be given a truly once in a lifetime opportunity, via the Know Goa Programme (KGP), to visit Goa as guests of the Goa government and act as youth ambassadors for Sydney-Australia.

The Know Goa Programme is formulated for the benefit of Goan Diaspora Youth who are not Indian Nationals but whose parents and/or grandparents are of Indian origin, and have had no opportunity to discover their roots in India in general and Goa in particular.

At the 2013 Christmas Dinner Dance they presented their experience s, as one that was a real eye-opener which helped them to understand their ancestry and how that shapes the individuals they are today.

Over the span of two weeks bridging November and December, they travelled around the state of Goa in a tour bus with 12 other wonderfully remarkable and like-minded ambassadors of their own nations. There were five from Canada, one from Kenya, three from Tanzania, one from the UK and three from Australia (one from Perth, and of course, the two from Sydney). They were taken to see places like the National Institute of Oceanography, Goa University, BITS Pilani and Goa Chitra which gave them an insight into the development of Goa as a strong and vibrant state of India in its own right.

The youth ambassadors promoted the fact that as expatriate Goans we have still maintained a sense of our culturealthough in comparison, it is but a small pocket of what Goa itself, in all its grandeur, can provide - "If you want to experience Goa, you've got to go to Goa!"

They were also privileged enough to be able to meet with the Honorable Governor of Goa, Mr. Bharat Vir Wanchoo.

## The Cross in our bodies

This is a pretty neat story and an interesting thing that few of us know.


"A couple of days ago I was running (I use that term very loosely) on my treadmill, watching a DVD sermon by Louie Giglio... And I was BLOWN AWAY! I want to share what I learned...."

"He (Louie) was talking about how inconceivably BIG our God is... How He spoke the universe into being... How He breathes stars out of His mouth that are huge raging balls of fire... Etc. Then He went on to speak of how this starbreathing, universe creating God ALSO knitted our human bodies together with amazing detail and wonder. At this point I am LOVING it (fascinating from a medical standpoint, you know.). And I was remembering how I was constantly amazed during medical school as I learned more and more about God's handiwork. I remember so many times thinking...'How can ANYONE deny that a Creator did all of this????'

And then I lost my breath. And it wasn't because I was running my treadmill, either!!! It was because Louie started talking about'laminin.' Being a doctor, I knew about 'laminin'.... And, for the lay person here is how Wikipedia describes them:


Now tell me that our God is not the coolest!!! Amazing- The glue that holds us together- ALL of us- Is in the shape of the cross.

## Goan Roast Beef

Do you have fond memories of Roast Meat Sandwiches? Those finely cut slices of brown meat stuck between two slices of bread and butter. Used to be my favorite snack during work or play, pop in some greens and consider it a meal.

I would recommend doing this as a side dish, this is something to be eaten as a side dish or weekend sandwiches with a dash of mayo mustard and greens. I also like eating it along with some dal rice/ kichdi:) but then i feel it requires a tad bit more spice.

## Ingredients for Goan Roast Beef

- 1 Onion of Garlic
- 1 1/2 Inch Ginger
- 8 10 Peppercorns
- 6 8 Cloves
- 2 Inch Piece Cinnamon
- 1 Teaspoon Turmeric Powder
- 1 Teaspoon Cumin Seeds

### **Roast Beef Ingredients:**

- 1 Kilo Beef
- 2 Tablespoon Vinegar or Juice of 1

Sour Lime

Salt as Per Taste

- 1/2 Onion
- 3 Whole Kashmiri Chilies

Oil

2 Teaspoons Sugar





Procedure:

Salt the meat and keep aside. Pound or grind the  ${\bf 5}$  Spice Masala ingredients,

Add the ginger garlic paste to the chunk of beef then add the vinegarOnce the vinegar is added, apply the spices to the meat.

The meat is cut like this so the spices can be put into the grooves and to ensure it gets into every part of it. Once this is done, keep it aside with a weight on it for 45 minutes to an hour. Pour some oil into the pressure cooker, when hot add some sugar and wait till its caramelized (becomes brown).

Add the chunk of beef to it and enjoy the sizzle:) Use a fork and keep turning it around till all the sides are nice and brown then add the onions and chillies. Put some water in the vessel you stored the meat under pressure in so we don't lose any of the masala and pour it in to the pressure cooker. Once its all in close the pressure cooker and turn on the heat, slower the better. In around 45 minutes depending on the heat, open up the pressure cooker



in-case you added too much water this would not be recommended as you will over cook the meat.

There you have it, the Goan Beef Roast:) Do you want a slice? Go ahead make your kids those sandwiches their friends will talk about!
